I am impressed by the multitude of screening information incorporated in the CalEnvironScreen tool. I believe additional environmental data could be incorporated to show the levels of lead (Pb) along our major freeways. The type of lead detected is called Aerially Deposited Lead or ADL for short which is from past use of gasoline with lead (Pb) additives. The only problem I see is collecting all of past reports and linking this data to the geographic information system. This would take a significant amount of staff time to accomplish.
