

UPDATED INFORMATIVE DIGEST
22 CALIFORNIA CODE OF REGULATIONS

The Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment (OEHHA) adopts the regulatory level for the chemical naphthalene which was included in the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking published in the California Regulatory Notice Register on July 2, 2004. Regulatory levels for eight other chemicals (1,2-dichloropropane, 1,2-dibromo-3-chloropropane, disodium cyanodithioimidocarbonate, ethyl dipropylthiocarbamate, ethylene glycol monomethyl ether, ethylene glycol monomethyl ether acetate, methyl bromide as a structural fumigant, and thiophanate-methyl) which were included in the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking were adopted and effective on January 22, 2005. The regulatory adoption of the level for the remaining chemical sodium dimethyldithiocarbamate is currently being reviewed by the Office of Administrative Law (OAL). OEHHA has revised the risk assessment document for naphthalene which it has relied upon for the proposed regulation in response to public comments submitted during the 45-day comment period which closed on August 23, 2004. There have been no other changes in the laws related to the proposed regulations or to the effect of the proposed regulations from the laws and effects described in the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking.
