Dear Mr. Hirsch:

This letter responds to your letter to Assistant Administrator James B. Gulliford dated March 28, 2008, asking the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Office of Prevention, Pesticides and Toxic Substances to identify those chemicals required by EPA under section 4(a) of the Toxic Substances Control Act to have testing for carcinogenicity or reproductive toxicity. This request is part of an annual update of "the list of chemicals which have not yet been adequately tested as required under Title 22, California Code of Regulations, Section 14000."

For the record, EPA has not required any additional chemical to be tested for carcinogenicity or reproductive toxicity in the past year.
