I base this reasoning on a review of peer reviewed scientific reports.

- 2006 Harvard study by Elise Bassin showing water fluoridation poses an increase of osteosarcoma in young boys (1)
- 1992 New Jersey Dept of Health study showing an increase in osteosarcoma rates in fluoridated vs. non-fluoridated areas (2)
- 2006 the National Research Council review on fluoride toxicology found a fluoride/bone cancer link is plausible
