

OEHHA Activities Regarding Acrylamide as a Proposition 65 Carcinogen

- **January-February 1990**
 - Listed as a Proposition 65 carcinogen
 - No Significant Risk Level adopted
- **March 2003**
 - CRNR request for public input
- **May 2003**
 - Workshop: “Regulatory Options Regarding Acrylamide in Food”
- **August 2003**
 - Proposed Acrylamide Work Plan
- **October 2003**
 - Consultation with CIC



OEHHA's Proposed Work Plan for Acrylamide in Foods

1. Update NSRL

- Guides review of food concentrations and consumption data for determining exposures below NSRL

2. Identify appropriate method for measuring acrylamide concentration in food

- Guides the identification of foods having acrylamide concentrations below limit of detection



Proposed Work Plan for Acrylamide in Foods (Continued)

- 3. Identify alternative acrylamide exposure levels for certain foods that exceed the revised NSRL, based on public health considerations**
- 4. Identify form and content of warnings for foods causing risks above no significant risk**
