Subject: Achieving the Human Right to Water in California: An Assessment of the State’s Community Water Systems

Dear Ms. Balazs,

The San Francisco Public Utilities Commission (SFPUC) shares the state’s commitment to the human right to water and welcomes the opportunity to comment on the Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment’s (OEHHA’s) August 2019 Draft Report and Tool. As a member of the California Urban Water Association (CUWA), we strongly support their comments and incorporate them by reference. In specific, we wanted to use this letter to comment on some inaccuracies in the information currently reported by the tool and suggest that OEHHA find a way going forward to allow water agencies to either comment on draft data prior to posting or allow for water agencies to post comments in a public manner on data presented if it is inaccurate or requires context. We have found the following inaccuracies under Accessibility:

- Treasure Island is listed as a groundwater-only system. This is incorrect. The SFPUC provides water to Treasure Island from the SFPUC Regional Water System. Treasure Island is considered a retail customer within the City and County of San Francisco service area.
- Groveland is listed as a groundwater-only system. The SFPUC provides water to Groveland from the SFPUC Regional Water System.
- Sunol is also listed as a groundwater-only system. It also receives water from the SFPUC Regional Water System.
