SUBJECT: ADOPTION OF REVISED CANCER INHALATION UNIT RISK FACTOR

FOR COBALT SULFATE HEPTAHYDRATE AND WATER-SOLUBLE

**COBALT COMPOUNDS** 

The Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment (OEHHA) has adopted a revised cancer inhalation unit risk (IUR) for cobalt sulfate heptahydrate and water-soluble cobalt compounds for use in the Air Toxics Hot Spots (Hot Spots) program, effective today. These values have been provided to the California Air Resources Board for incorporation into the Hotspots Analysis and Reporting Program (HARP) software suite. HARP software is used to generate Hot Spots facility health risk assessments.

Cobalt in various forms has many industrial uses, including as catalysts in the oil and chemical industries, and as components in solar panels and lithium- and nickel-based rechargeable batteries. Cobalt air emissions sources in California include the petroleum industry, cement kilns, semiconductor and electronic components facilities, aerospace product and parts manufacturing, alloy manufacturing, and battery manufacturers.

A draft document for the revised cobalt and cobalt compounds IUR was submitted for public comments in May 2023, and peer reviewed by the State's Scientific Review Panel (SRP) on Toxic Air Contaminants in June 2023. No public comments on this document were received. Following SRP review, the draft was finalized.

The final documents that describe the scientific basis for the cobalt and cobalt compounds IUR and slope factor are attached and are being made available on the OEHHA Web site today.
