

UPDATED INFORMATIVE DIGEST  
22 CALIFORNIA CODE OF REGULATIONS

The Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment (OEHHA) adopts the regulatory levels for eight of the ten chemicals, 1,2-dichloropropane, 1,2-dibromo-3-chloropropane, disodium cyanodithioimidocarbonate, ethyl dipropylthiocarbamate, ethylene glycol monomethyl ether, ethylene glycol monomethyl ether acetate, methyl bromide as a structural fumigant, and thiophanate-methyl, which were included in the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking published in the California Regulatory Notice Register on July 2, 2004. OEHHA will proceed with the regulatory adoption of the levels for the remaining two chemicals, naphthalene and sodium dimethyldithiocarbamate, at a later time. There have been no other changes in the laws related to the proposed regulations or to the effect of the proposed regulations from the laws and effects described in the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking.
