# SPECIFIC REGULATORY LEVELS: CHEMICALS CAUSING REPRODUCTIVE TOXICITY

MAXIMUM ALLOWABLE DOSE LEVEL (ORAL EXPOSURE) ATRAZINE, PROPAZINE, SIMAZINE, 2,3-DIAMINO-6-CHLORO-S-TRIAZINE (DACT), DESETHYL ATRAZINE (DEA), AND DES-ISOPROPYL ATRAZINE (DIA)

JULY 24, 2015 (posted on OEHHA's website on July 10, 2014)

On June 12, 2015, OEHHA published a notice in the *California Regulatory Notice Register* proposing to adopt Maximum Allowable Dose Levels (MADLs) of 100 micrograms per day for oral exposure to atrazine, propazine, simazine, 2,3-diamino-6-chloro-s-triazine (DACT), des-ethyl atrazine (DEA), and des-isopropyl atrazine (DIA), by amending Title 27, California Code of Regulations, section 25805.

Publication of the prior notice initiated a 45-day public comment period that was scheduled to close on July 27, 2015. OEHHA has received a request for an extension from Syngenta Crop Protection. **OEHHA hereby extends the public comment period on this proposed amendment to 5 p.m., Thursday, October 1, 2015.**<sup>1</sup>
