OEHHA's Activities:

California's Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment (OEHHA) conducts cutting-edge work in evaluating hazards and risks from toxic chemicals in the environment. These evaluations frequently are the subject of statewide, national and even international interest, and are used by the various regulatory programs in California. Examples of OEHHA's activities include:

- Assessing risk to guide the development of California's air quality and drinking water standards.
- Determining when Californians need to be warned of chemical exposures under the state's unique Proposition 65 law.
- Developing & updating CalEnviroScreen, a tool that identifies California communities with the highest pollution burdens and vulnerabilities.
- Tracking the impact of climate change on California.
- Providing safe-eating advice for the public concerning chemicals in California sport fish.
- Conducting epidemiology studies of air pollution and the effects of climate change.
- Developing a human "right to water" tool to evaluate people's access to high quality, affordable drinking water.
- Being called upon by California's governor and legislature to conduct first of their kind evaluations of chemical hazards impacting communities and sensitive subgroups, including children.

Steps to a State Job:

1. **SEARCH for a job at www.calcareers.ca.gov:** — Click "Get A State Job," where you can browse career fields and see available jobs. Once you find the job you want to apply for, read the job's bulletin to see the qualifications needed.

2. **ASSESSMENT** — Your education, experience, abilities, and knowledge will be evaluated through an assessment or exam (either online or a testing center). If you have previously taken an assessment/exam and are still eligible, move on to the next step.
3. **APPLICATION** — Fill out the standard state application template and submit online or hard copy via US Mail to apply for job vacancies.
