NOTICE TO INTERESTED PARTIES

PROPOSITION 65
PRE-REGULATORY WORKSHOP FOR POTENTIAL AMENDMENTS TO

TITLE 27, CALIFORNIA CODE OF REGULATIONS
**SECTION 25705(b), SPECIFIC REGULATORY LEVELS
POSING NO SIGNIFICANT RISK
AND
NEW SECTION 25901, VINYL ACETATE**

SEPTEMBER 21, 2026

The Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment (OEHHA) is the lead agency for implementation of Proposition 65.¹ As part of its duties, OEHHA has authority to adopt, amend and repeal regulations related to the Act.²

OEHHA will hold a pre-regulatory workshop to discuss a potential set of amendments to existing Proposition 65 regulations on September 30, 2026. This public meeting will be held online from 10:00 am to 11:30 am PST, or until all business is conducted. The regulatory amendments under consideration would add a no significant risk level (NSRL) for vinyl acetate to Title 27, California Code of Regulations, section 25705(b)³ and add a new section 25901 to clarify the analytical methods that may be used to demonstrate vinyl acetate exposures when establishing the basis of a Certificate of Merit for Proposition 65 purposes.

As a starting point for discussion, OEHHA is providing draft regulatory language and explanatory information for this set of possible regulatory amendments on its website at www.OEHHA.ca.gov/prop65. These are pre-regulatory documents that could change substantially prior to the commencement of a formal rulemaking. Additional opportunities for public comment will be provided during the formal rulemaking process.
